Established in 1987, the Society of Directors of Research in Medical Education (SDRME) is comprised of directors of units in medical schools responsible for educational research, curriculum development or evaluation.

There are currently more than 58 members from the U.S. and Canada, and 25 international members from Africa, Asia, Australia, Europe, North America, and South America.

Since its inception SDRME has been dedicated to enhancing the quality of medical education through:

- Promoting quality research in medical education
- Facilitating collaboration among members and with other organizations
- Creating professional development opportunities for members
- Working to influence national research policy in medical education

### Eligibility

While there are some institutional conditions required for membership, it is the director who will become the SDRME member. Essentials for membership include:

- A recognizable organizational identity within an institution
- Institutional scope with roles and responsibilities for conducting medical education research in (at least) undergraduate medical education within an accredited allopathic or osteopathic medical school

#### The Director:

- Needs to be actively involved in medical education research
- Must have clear authority and primary responsibility for the research conducted within the unit, whether or not the unit involves multiple administrative lines

### **Annual Meetings**

SDRME conducts two meetings each year:

A summer meeting includes presentations and discussions relevant to medical education research. Distinguished national speakers are invited to provide insights for the future of medical education.

A short business meeting and member networking event is held each fall in conjunction with the AAMC Annual Meeting.

### **Biennial Survey**

SDRME conducts a biennial survey of directors which collects valuable data about the functions of offices, staffing and general budget information.

### Scholarship

SDRME strives to provide annual funding to support the preparation of a scholarly paper on a timely topic in medical education, typically in the form of a literature review. It is a competitive process whereby submissions are reviewed and selected by the Invited Review Selection Committee.
