### 4. Issues arising during this year's RFA ... open for comment

- Revised requirement for funding to make this a grant, not a personal award. Now requires a simple budget.
- Had an issue where the primary investigator wanted to push a trainee (resident) into the position as a presenter. This is yet another example of trying to get around the requirement of PI eligibility! ... We have revised the presentation requirement so that the PI must be the presenter unless another faculty co-I is approved. Non-faculty co-I's cannot present (although we would allow them to attend the meeting on their own dime).
- Once again, lots of people are proposing "scoping reviews." Not sure why this is such a fad right now. We funded two scoping reviews this year (one of which wasn't very good), and one last year. What to do? (probably nothing)
